His music is published and distributed by *Babel Scores*, a French publisher specialist in new music.

He is the pianist of Low Frequency Trio (Contemporary Bass clarinet, double bass, and piano ensemble), founding member of *áltaVoz* (Latin-American composers collaborative in the U.S), and former director of The Harvard Group for New Music.
